Anne P. Sidamon-Eristoff is a founding member of Black Rock Forest's Board of Directors with over 30 years of dedicated service. Mrs. Sidamon-Eristoff was instrumental in the Forest being conserved and transformed by William T. Golden and in helping it flourish over the succeeding decades. She is also Chairwoman Emerita of the American Museum of Natural History, Director Emerita at the World Wildlife Fund, and Trustee Emerita of the New York Community Trust. Her deep legacy of environmental leadership includes service as a trustee of the Hudson River Foundation, Storm King Art Center, Scenic Hudson, Hudson Highlands Land Trust and Hudson Highlands Nature Museum.

Mrs. Sidamon-Eristoff is a graduate of Bryn Mawr College. Her children Simon, Elizabeth, and Andrew, and their spouses, continue her legacy of service, support and leadership for many charitable and environmental organizations. Her late husband, Constantine, was a giant in the environmental movement and partnered with his wife on many of her causes.
